Poa Annua Deep Dive

Dr. Jim Brosnan

University of Tennessee

Poa annua has been ranked the most troublesome turfgrass weed and golf course superintendents in the Southeast certainly understand why. This presentation will provide an overview on managing Poa annua infestations on golf courses across the Southeast. Attendees will receive an update on the current status of herbicide resistance within Poa annua, strategies to manage resistance in the short term, as well as perspectives on what management might look like in the future. The presentation will provide an overview of Poa annua biology and discuss how disease management strategies could affect Poa annua management on different parts of the golf course. Finally, the presentation will conclude with open discussion about emerging weed issues superintendents will face entering the 2023 season and offer research-based recommendations for management.

Tim Hiers, Certified Golf Course Superintendent, White Oak Conservation

Speakers

Jim Brosnan, Ph.D.



Dr. Brosnan is a Professor in the Plant Sciences
Department at the
University of Tennessee
(UT) and Director of the
UT Weed Diagnostics
Center. His research
focuses on controlling

unique and problematic turfgrass weeds, particularly those with resistance to herbicides. His extension programs aim to provide education and diagnostic support to Tennessee's \$5.8 billion turfgrass industry.

Dr. Brosnan serves as an advisor to the Tennessee Turfgrass Association Board of Directors, and he is actively involved in the Weed Science Society of America. Southern Weed Science Society, Golf Course Superintendents Association of America, and Sports Turf Managers Association. He has consulted at multiple venues on the PGA Tour (including several major championship host sites) in addition to National Football League franchises. Dr. Brosnan received a B.S. in turfgrass science from Penn State University, an M.S. in plant, soil and insect sciences (turfgrass) from the University of Massachusetts Amherst, and a Ph.D. in agronomy (turfgrass) from Penn State University.

Jim Dickson is the Golf Course Superintendent at Sugar Hill Golf Club. He has been in the golf business for over 29 years. Jim joined the Marine Corps after high school and served as an

infantry expert in operating ground-to-air missiles. He added three years of service in the reserves until he found his way onto the grounds staff at Royal Lakes Golf and Country Club. Throughout his 29 years in the business, Jim has worked at Chateau Elan, Scales Creek, and Lanier Golf Club. He is married to Tracy, and they have one daughter, Caroline.

He is a 2013 Georgia Environmental Foundation's Leadership Award recipient, the 2021 Valdosta State University Mathematics and Science Alumnus of the Year, and has served as an author and contributor to water resource and water planning publications. Dr. Patrick McCullough



Dr. Patrick McCullough is an associate professor in the Crop and Soil Sciences Department at the University of Georgia. Dr. McCullough received his Ph.D. from Rutgers University and

joined the UGA faculty in January 2009. He specializes in weed science for turfgrass, pastures, and industrial vegetation management. Dr. McCullough's research efforts focus on herbicide resistance management, new product evaluations, growth regulators, and invasive weed control.

Dr. Brian Schwartz



Brian Schwartz is an Associate Professor of Turfgrass Breeding in the Department of Crop & Soil Sciences at the University of Georgia in Tifton. He earned his B.S. (Plant and Environmental

Soil Sciences) and M.S. (Plant Breeding) degrees at Texas A&M University, and afterwards studied Turfgrass Breeding at the University of Florida where he received his Ph.D. in Agronomy, Dr. Schwartz has experience with the breeding and evaluation of bermudagrass, zovsiagrass, centipedegrass, tall fescue, cotton and corn. Additionally, he has been the lead or co-developer of 9 cultivars and 12 associate cultivars resulting in the award of 12 patents to date, which includes the release of the drought tolerant bermudagrass 'TifTuf' that has been licensed to 53 domestic sod producers as well as 43 international growers and is grown on over 6,000 acres across the globe. He has been the lead or junior author on 56 refereed journal articles, 2 book chapters, and 15 popular press publications. Dr. Schwartz teaches a Plant Breeding Practicum course at the University of Georgia and is a member of the International Turfgrass Society, the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America, the United States Golf Association, the Turfgrass Breeder's Association, the American Society of Agronomy, and the Crop Science Society of America.
